SafeLot Guest Spotlight: Michael

Michael, married for 36 years and a father of three, has always been a hard worker, even throughout the pandemic. However, after contracting COVID, he was diagnosed with COPD and eventually Long COVID. The unpaid leave and mounting bills, treatments and medicines for he and his wife were more than their bank account could handle and left them unable to pay their rent. After staying with one daughter for a while, they eventually had to move out and shelter in their vehicle. For months they were shuttling from store parking lots, encampments, and quiet streets until they found out about safe parking. Finding CSPI ended up providing a source of income as well as a place to sleep at night.

CSPI Program Update

Our first quarter of 2023 is off to an amazing start. We began 2022 with 7 CSPI SafeLots and now operate 13 across 5 Denver metro counties, with an ability to accommodate 110 households per night.



However, in 2022, we also had almost double the number of calls for assistance, meaning CSPI still has a long way to go to meet the need.

CSPI's focus in 2023 is working to ensure sustainability of our current SafeLots and planning future expansion. CSPI receives many calls from communities and municipalities around the state asking for technical assistance and instruction on what it would take to start a (cont'd next page)
